**Last Meeting: 12 June - David Dunlap, Singer / Historical Entertainer**

Dave Dunlap is a retired Army Colonel who specializes in patriotic song and dance presentations. He opens with a talk on the history of freedom and democracy in the US. He opened with a tap dance while singing “Yankee Doodle Dandy”. Following a description of the bombardment of Ft. McHenry in the War of 1812, we all sang the “Star Spangled Banner.” After “My Country Tis of Thee,” Dave discussed the song of slavery written by a former slave ship captain – “Amazing Grace.” Songs of the Civil War included “Dixie” in the South and “Battle Hymn of the Republic” in the North. “America” was written in 1913 and the song for WW1 was “Over There.” “God Bless America” was written in 1919 after the war, but it was not heard much until 1938 when Kate Smith made it her signature song. Dave closed singing and tapping to “When Your’re Smiling”, “Singing in the Rain”, and Smile When Your Heart is Breaking”.
