Last Meeting: May 14 - Erica Hochberger gave us an overview of her work at the National Children's Advocacy Center(NCAC)

Ms Hochberger explained the NCAC was created to address the number of times a child had to explain their story of abuse to a series of government agencies; DHR, law enforcement, juvenile justice, etc. As a District Attorney, Bud Cramer was familiar with the problems children were experiencing so as



a Congressional Representative he helped create the NCAC for Huntsville. It grew from that beginning to a nationwide operation(over 1000 centers) with a training center and national convention center in Huntsville. Now DHR or the Police department contact NCAC when an abused child enters the system. NCAC assigns an advocate trained in working with children and familiar with the legal system operations. NCAC offers not only help for an abused child but also their parents and families. They provide seven intervention services and eight prevention services that provide broad spectrum of support for an abused child. For details on these services, go to <http://www.nationalcac.org>

People legally obligated to report suspicions sometimes err on the side of caution.

MS Hochberger explained that only half of the roughly 565 forensic interviews conducted each year result in a substantiated case of abuse. As for how you might help the NCAC they especially need people to provide rides to the families and translators to help address multiple cultures.
